

Public Source Sheet: Max Wolfley Budget and Spending Votes

Summary

Public records show Rep. Max Wolfley voted yes on the April 2026 general appropriations bill, SB1177, which the official House bill summary describes as a \$12.82 billion FY2027 state budget. Public records also show Wolfley voted yes on every general appropriations bill reviewed for his House tenure, as annual appropriations grew from about \$9.06 billion in FY2022 to \$12.82 billion for FY2027.

The same public record also shows Wolfley voting yes on budget items including \$48.9 million for higher education faculty pay raises, \$18 million for the Oklahoma Museum of Popular Culture, and HB1571, which removed the expiration date for the Route 66 Commission. Public grant documents and coverage of that commission's grants identify a Hydro Route 66 project that includes a custom cow food vending machine.

Public Claim Supported by These Sources

Rep. Max Wolfley voted for the April 2026 \$12.82 billion general appropriations bill. Since taking office, he has voted yes on every general appropriations bill reviewed, as state appropriations grew from about \$9.06 billion in FY2022 to \$12.82 billion for FY2027. He also voted yes on spending items including \$48.9 million for higher education faculty pay raises, \$18 million for the Oklahoma Museum of Popular Culture, and the Route 66 Commission extension tied to grant projects that include a custom cow food vending machine.
