

Public Source Sheet: Max Wolfley Fee and Tax Increase Votes

Summary

Rep. Max Wolfley voted for multiple bills that raised fees, created new taxes, or authorized new local taxing powers. The bills below are supported by official public records and external public sources.

HB1590, 2023 - 911 Phone Fee Increase

Brief description: Increased the monthly 911 fee from \$0.75 to \$1.25 per line, a roughly 66.7% increase.

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HB2046, 2021-2022 - Higher Education Property-Tax Districts

Brief description: Created the Higher Education Institution Local Funding Act, allowing certain two-year colleges to propose local funding districts supported by ad valorem/property tax after voter approval.

Wolfley vote: Yes on 2021 House passage; yes on 2022 final passage and veto override.

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HB2234, 2021 - Electric Vehicle Charging Tax

Brief description: Created the DRIVE Act tax on electricity used to charge electric vehicles at public charging stations. The Oklahoma Tax Commission describes the tax as \$0.03 per kilowatt-hour beginning January 1, 2024.

Wolfley vote: Yes on House passage.

HB1967, 2024 - County EMS Sales-Tax Authority

Brief description: Authorized counties to call a vote on a county sales tax for emergency medical services. The bill text authorized a sales tax not to exceed 1%.

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HB2141, 2024 - Cosmetology and Barber Licensing Fees

Brief description: Increased multiple cosmetology and barber licensing fees. Examples in the enrolled bill include annual license fees from \$25 to \$40 and establishment renewal fees from \$30 to \$45.

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SB600, 2025 - CASA Court Assessment

Brief description: Increased the court assessment for the Oklahoma Court Appointed Special Advocates Association from \$5 to \$10. The fiscal impact statement estimated a full-year impact of about \$1.2 million.

HB1392, 2025 - Mortgage Certification Fee

Brief description: Doubled the county treasurer mortgage certification fee from \$5 to \$10.

SB1516, 2024 - Medicolegal and Cremation Permit Fees

Brief description: Increased the fee range for a cremation permit from \$100-\$200 to \$200-\$275. The House bill summary estimated a \$932,155 annual revenue increase.
